Ladies and Gentlemen,

1. First and foremost, I wish to extend my warmest congratulations to the organisers for successfully convening the **3rd Sustainability Environment Asia** (SEA) Conference 2025. Your commitment to advancing meaningful dialogue on sustainability is truly commendable.

"The major key to your better future is you." - Jim Rohn Indeed, by gathering here today, each of us becomes a co-creator of a more sustainable future.

2. We gather at a defining moment for humanity. Across the world, the impacts of climate change are no longer distant forecasts — they are lived realities that shape our economies, our communities, and our very way of life. 3. This is a reminder that sustainability is not merely a policy pursuit, but a **moral responsibility**. It is about stewardship, caring for what we have been entrusted with.

"The Earth is not ours; it is a trust we hold for those who come after us."

- 4. I am encouraged that this year's SEA focuses on **ESG**, water, and carbon three pillars that define not only the future of our industries, but the wellbeing of our people and planet.
- 5. In 2015, Malaysia joined the global community in adopting the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, committing to 17 Goals and 169 targets. Yet, as the 2025 SDG Progress Report reveals, only 35% of targets are on track.
- 6. For the Asia-Pacific region, home to 60% of the world's population, the path ahead is steep. But it is also full of opportunities to innovate, to collaborate, and to transform.

7. To succeed, we must move forward not in silos but as partners, uniting governments, industries, and communities under one shared purpose.

Distinguished Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen,

- 8. Malaysia's transition is guided by a principle we call the **Energy Trilemma** ensuring that energy remains **secure**, **affordable**, **and sustainable**.
- Under the National Energy Transition Roadmap (NETR), we are on course to achieve 70% renewable energy in installed capacity by 2050.
- But beyond targets, our mission is to create a transformation that uplifts lives and strengthens national resilience.
- 11. The 2026 National Budget reinforces this through policy reforms, incentives, and programmes such as Corporate Green Power Program (CGPP), Corporate Renewable Energy Supply Scheme (CRESS), and

Large-Scale Solar (LSS) PETRA 5+, which are accelerating renewable energy deployment and investment confidence.

- 12. I am pleased to share that Malaysia has exceeded its 2025 renewable energy target ahead of schedule a strong signal of our momentum and resolve.
- 13. Our approach is pragmatic. We are expanding solar, hydro, waste-to-energy, and green hydrogen solutions, supported by energy storage and the potential role of nuclear under the **13th Malaysia Plan** all while maintaining natural gas as a transition fuel.

In the words of the late Tun Abdul Razak: "Progress is not achieved by chance, but by the courage to move forward with purpose."

14. And it is with that same courage that Malaysia continues to move forward — not waiting for change, but leading it; not merely adapting to the future, but shaping it through vision, unity, and unwavering resolve.

Distinguished Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen,

- 15. Water is the essence of life and the foundation of all economic activity.
- 16. Malaysia aspires to become a **regional centre of excellence in water management by 2040**, driven by innovation, digitalisation, and skilled talent.
- 17. We have reached **97.1% clean water and** sanitation coverage in rural areas, nearing our goal of full access ensuring that no community is left behind.
- 18. As our nation evolves into a **regional data centre hub**, we are proactively managing high water usage by:
 - Reviewing tariff structures for heavy industries;
 and
 - Promoting recycled water and district cooling technologies.
- 19. This ensures that growth remains responsible and sustainability remains at the heart of progress.

- 20. Malaysia's **ASEAN Chairmanship in 2025**, under the theme "*Inclusivity and Sustainability*" reflects the spirit of this region: unity through diversity, and growth through shared responsibility.
- 21. We are honoured to welcome **Timor-Leste as ASEAN's 11th member**, enriching our community with greater cultural and economic diversity.
- 22. Among our key priorities is advancing the **Enhanced ASEAN Power Grid (APG)**, a milestone towards an interconnected ASEAN energy market powered by renewables.
- 23. At **AMEM-43**, ASEAN member states reaffirmed our 2030 aspirations:
 - 40% reduction in energy intensity,
 - 30% renewable share in Total Primary Energy Supply, and
 - 45% renewable share in installed power capacity.
- 24. These ambitions position ASEAN to rise as the world's fourth-largest economy by 2030 one built

not only on growth, but on shared sustainability and resilience.

Distinguished Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen,

- 25. The path to sustainability demands courage, consistency, and compassion. It is not a race against each other but a journey together towards a better tomorrow.
- 26. Governments can set the direction, but the transformation must be driven by **partnerships**, between public and private sectors, between knowledge and action, between ambition and empathy.
- 27. I call upon every business leader, policymakers, industry players and community leaders to work hand in hand to make sustainability not just a goal to pursue, but the lens through which we see, decide, and define our shared destiny.

- 28. Let us build a Malaysia, and a region, where progress uplifts humanity, where prosperity honours the planet, and where every generation inherits a future brighter than the one before.
- 29. With lafaz Bismillahirrahmanirrahim, it is my great honour to declare the 3rd Sustainability Environment Asia (SEA) Conference 2025 officially open.
- 30. May today's dialogue inspire new ideas, bold actions, and enduring partnerships for a greener and more sustainable tomorrow.
